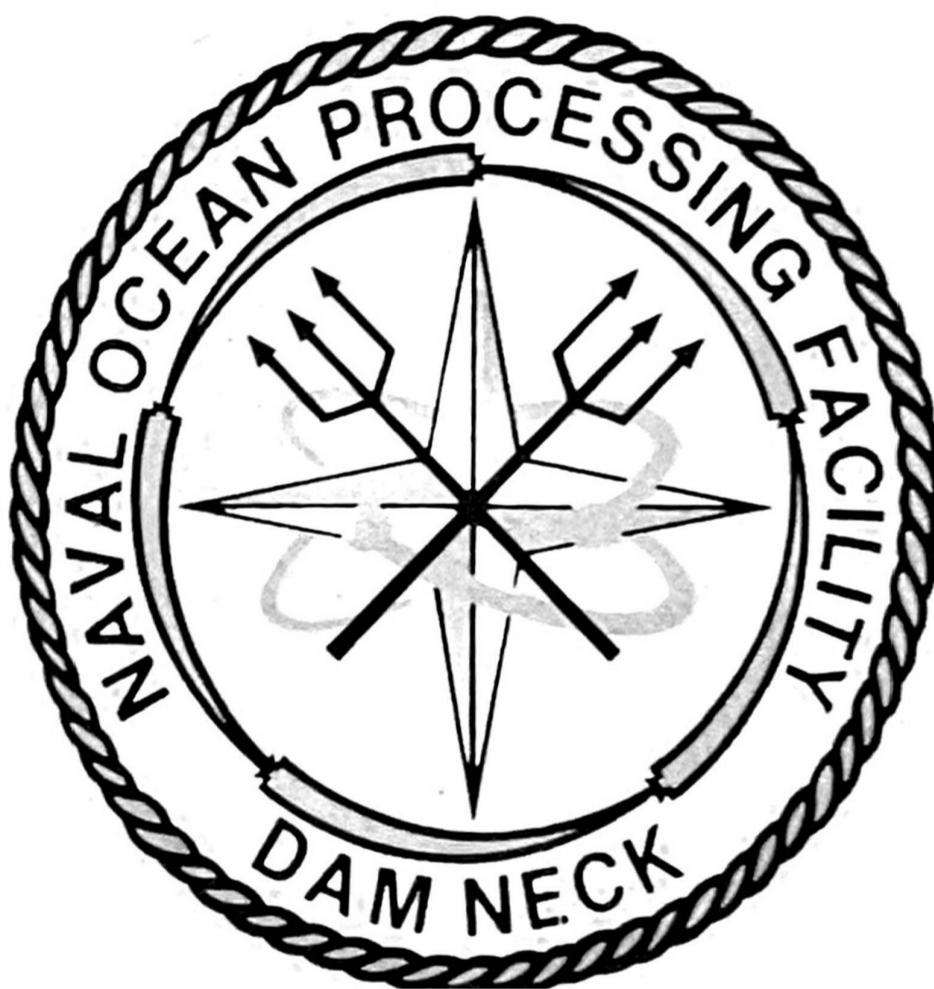

Capt. P.L. Hryskanich, U.S. Navy



Captain Paul L. Hryskanich graduated from the University of South Carolina in 1954 with a B.S. in Mechanical Engineering. He was commissioned through the Naval Reserve Officer Training Corps program in June 1954.

Following flight training, Captain Hryskanich served operational tours with Helicopter Training Group, Pensacola, Florida, as a flight instructor for Helicopter Antisubmarine Squad-

rons THREE and SEVEN. In 1960 he entered the Weapons Systems Engineering curriculum at the Naval Post Graduate School, Monterey, California, graduating in 1962 with a B.S. in Electrical Engineering. He then reported to Commander, Patrol Wing ELEVEN as Staff Weapons Officer. From May 1965 to August 1968, Captain Hryskanich served as Commanding Officer, U.S. Naval Facility, Bermuda. Subsequent tours included the Officer of the Chief of Naval Operations (OP-95; Head, Fixed Surveillance Systems); the staff of Commander Oceanographic System Pacific (Operations and Plans Officer); and the Chief of Staff Officer of Commander Oceanographic System Atlantic. In September 1979, he assumed command as Commanding Officer, Naval Ocean Processing Facility, Dam Neck, Virginia.

Captain Hryskanich wears the Meritorious Service Medal, Navy Commendation Medal, and the Meritorious Unit Commendation.

Captain Hryskanich is married to the former Barbara Nyholm of Duluth, Minnesota, and they have two children, Jill and John. Captain and Mrs. Hryskanich reside in Virginia Beach, Virginia.
